ACT Testing

The ACT test is offered locally 7 times per year for high school students. For those who intend on attending a post-secondary institution, taking the ACT is an important step in the acceptance process for universities and colleges. While the district does pay for all juniors to take the test one time in the Spring of their junior year, it is very helpful to take the test prior to the Spring of the junior year.
